A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR NATACHA ~

Holy Humor Sunday!!! GET YOUR LAUGH ON!!!!!!

Holy Humor Sunday not only gives Christians an opportunity for ongoing celebrations of the greatest miracle in human history - Jesus' resurrection - it also gives each of us an opportunity to celebrate, and give thanks for, our own smaller resurrections in this world and this life.

From time to time in our earthly lives, many of us have been dead - from illness, depression, physical injuries, emotional wounds, the loss of loved ones, financial losses - and yet have come alive and endured while looking forward to the Great Resurrection.

If you Google "Holy Humor Sunday" on the Internet, you'll be amazed at how widespread Holy Humor Sunday celebrations on the Sunday after Easter have become among churches of all traditions. It's clearly a movement of the Holy Spirit to shore up belief in the resurrection of Jesus. Many American churches are resurrecting this old Easter custom begun by the early Greek Christians --- "Bright Sunday" or "Holy Humor Sunday" celebrations on the Sunday after Easter.

And the ongoing celebrations of Jesus' resurrection are bringing large crowds back to churches on a Sunday when church attendance typically drops dramatically. Holy Humor Sunday celebrations have become a tradition in churches that congregations look forward to. For centuries in all Christian faith traditions, the week following Easter Sunday was observed by the faithful as "days of joy and laughter" with parties and picnics to celebrate Jesus' "Easter laugh." Churchgoers and pastors played practical jokes on each other, told jokes, sang, and danced. The custom slowly vanished in the last century as belief in the resurrection declined.

In 1988, the Fellowship of Merry Christians began encouraging churches to resurrect Bright Sunday services with the theme: "Jesus is the LIFE of the party." This year the theme is "Humor and Hope for the Hard Times."

Many churches responded enthusiastically and named it Holy Humor Sunday. Churches decorated their sanctuaries with helium-filled balloons with joyful Scriptural messages, cardboard butterflies (a symbol of the resurrection), smiley faces, and posters emblazoned with messages like "Smile! God Loves You!" and "Christ is Risen! Smile!" Congregations sang "Easter carols," based on the music of Christmas carols, with the lyrics composed by Lutheran Pastor Paul Lintern of Mansfield, OH. Choirs led congregations in a variety of old and new joyful hymns and songs. Churches distributed to church members plastic Easter eggs, each with a clean joke or cartoon inside. "Pastors welcome the Holy Humor Sunday idea when they discover that it is solidly grounded theologically and historically," said Rev. Kraft.

The First Congregational Church of Royal Oak, MI, staged a fully costumed series of baseball sketches in a nine-inning baseball Holy Humor Sunday service. Pastor John Miller, dressed in a baseball uniform, pitched his sermon from the mound -- i.e., pulpit - while two relief preachers warmed up in a makeshift bullpen on the side. In the middle of his sermon, a young coach stopped the service, said loudly, "John, you don't have it today," and called for a relief preacher. On Holy Humor Sunday at Westminster Presbyterian Church in Portland, OR, Rev. Dr. Jim Moiso's sermon was titled "Foolish Joy."

On Holy Humor Sunday, many churches featured on their bulletin covers the Fellowship of Merry Christians' phenomenally popular print of "The Risen Christ by the Sea," a painting of a joyful, smiling, triumphant Risen Christ surprising His disciples at the Sea of Tiberias.

Pastor Jim Arends of Prince of Peace Lutheran Church in La Crescent, MN, said, "This gives us a chance to celebrate the joy of Easter in a fun way a week after we've celebrated it in a glorious way . . . We don't celebrate this to increase attendance, but it has had that effect."

Even in churches which did not have a Holy Humor Sunday program, many pastors, including western and eastern Catholic priests, acknowledged the "Easter laugh" theme in their sermons on the Sunday after Easter.

The Little Cedar Lutheran Church Council met on Wednesday, February 20, 2013 @8pm, following Lenten services. Present: Karen Anderson, Gordy Briggs, Becky Hartwig, Pat Hinz, Bill Klingerman, Maynard Lewison, Joe Matheis, Lyn Meany, Tricia Milks, Rod Nordeng, Mary Schmitz, Tracy Smith, Jaymie Poshusta, and Pastor Natacha Kemp. Absent: Nancy Smith. The meeting was called to order by Chair Pat Hinz.

DEVOTIONS/PRAYER: Linda Gilles

CORRESPONDENCE/RECOGNITION of VISITORS: None

APPROVAL of COUNCIL MINUTES: A motion by Becky Hartwig, seconded by Bill Klingerman to approve the secretary's minutes, for January, as printed. Motion carried.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Jaymie reported that in December 2012, the end of the month payroll was not entered into the Shepherd's Staff software program, so it did not show up until the January bank statement. Jaymie suggested that for the 2013 annual meeting report there should be a report month 13, 2012, to show only the missing items from 2012. There will also be a 2013 report which shows only 2013 information. A motion by Maynard Lewison, seconded by Gordy Briggs to approve Jaymie's suggestion to correct the error made on Shepherd's Staff software: motion reads: for the 2013 annual meeting there will be a report month 13 2012, which will show only the missing items from the end of December 2012. There will also be a 2013 report which shows only the 2013 information. Motion carried.

A motion by Mary Schmitz, seconded by Karen Anderson that corrections be made, for the 2012 accounting report, in the 2013 annual report. Motion carried.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

A. **Building:** Maynard reported that the sidewalk on the west side, leading to the daycare, needs to be replaced. It has sunk quite a bit. He and Bill put some crushed rock down to make it safer for parents and children entering from the west doors. The daycare committee brought to Maynard's attention that the cupboard doors/end panel of the counter cabinet, in the daycare, need to be replaced. They are peeling/chipping and it is a safety issue with the children. Maynard got a bid of \$375, from Rick Bottema, for replacing the 10 doors and end panel. A motion by Gordy Briggs, seconded by Tracy Smith to approve the hiring of Rick Bottema to replace the 10 doors, with new hinges, and an end panel, for \$375, material and labor. Motion carried. Maynard got a bid of \$965 (material and labor) from Voigt Plumbing for a new water heater that would be placed next to the old one, only to be turned on for use at the Lutefisk dinner, to handle all the hot water needed for doing dishes. He got a bid for an under the sink instant hot water heater (electric) for \$600 plus \$400 to install and wire it. Discussion followed and it was decided to table it for a few months, as is not needed at this time anyway.

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- B. Cemetery: Tracy Smith – no report at this time
- C. Daycare: Linda Gilles and Karen Anderson reporting. They met recently and discussed the cupboard door replacement and sidewalk issue, which was previously mentioned in the building report. Karen has been making quilts for the new babies that come to the daycare. She was spending her own money but was recently given money from the daycare so was able to make 5 more. To continue this gesture, she would need to be reimbursed for the cost of materials.
- D. Finance: Jaymie Poshusta reported on who is part of the committee.
- E. Life and Missions: Becky Hartwig reported that June Nelson and Joyce Halver are making visitations and that Carol Matheis and Nancy Thalberg are their drivers. Cause of the month envelopes can be found in the narthex.
- F. Personnel: Gordy Briggs reported on who is part of the committee. They met recently to update staff descriptions and have set February 28th as Pastor Natacha's evaluation date.
- G. Youth and Education: Tricia Milks
- H. Worship and Music: Pat Hinz reported on who is part of the committee and that they will be meeting in the coming weeks to discuss Good Friday services.
- Committee chairs are to get a list of their members to Pat so a new committee list can be typed up and handed out at the March meeting.

PASTOR'S REPORT: Pastor Natacha reported that the Interim Pastor's Quarterly Report is to be sent in on February 28th. She has been looking into copyright issues for recording church services and is waiting to hear back from a few places she emailed. Pat Hinz also inquired about this with Augsburg Publishers. Pastor is looking at a Bible Study series of 18 lessons, called the Parables Remix. Pastor also brought up the idea of a Messianic Passover Seder, which could be held March 13th, in lieu of the traditional Lenten service. Discussion followed. The service would be led by a Rabbi from the Twin Cities. He asks only for a place to spend the night. A motion by Tracy Smith, seconded by Becky Hartwig to proceed with Messianic Passover Seder, as presented by Pastor Natacha. Motion carried. Rod Nordeng suggested that we purchase a night's stay at The Rose Pedaler, for the Rabbi, following the service. Council agreed.

OUTSTANDING BUSINESS:

- A. Shepherd's Staff Software & Support for \$375/year: Jaymie Poshusta recommended we purchase this. A motion by Rod Nordeng, seconded by Mary Schmitz that we purchase the Shepherd's Software & Support for a year at \$375. Motion carried.
- B. Cause of the Month: discussion on whether council wanted to set a guaranteed amount each month for this. The matter was turned over to the Life and Missions committee to work on how to proceed with how often the Cause of the Month is run and if there should be guaranteed amounts.
- C. Water Heater: discussed under committee reports.
- D. Screen mounting labor fees: Maynard Lewison reported that Larry Wilson and John Wolterman mounted the wall screen. They ask for \$15 each for labor fees. A motion by Karen Anderson, seconded by Gordy Briggs to pay Larry Wilson and John Wolterman each the \$15 labor fee. Motion carried.
- E. Financial input from church organizations: Youth and WELCA will both be reporting their finances quarterly. Daycare committee will meet with Pat Hinz and Jaymie Poshusta, in the coming weeks, to come up with a plan for reporting the finances of the daycare.

NEW BUSINESS:

- A. New Constitution: copies of the new constitution will be printed up for council members, with a few extra to be kept in the office. The printing will include the two changes made at the annual meeting, those being: 5 not 6 members on the nominating committee and the auditing committee will have 3 members appointed by the council.
- B. Camperships: a motion by Tracy Smith, seconded by Tricia Milks to pay \$200 per camper to a religious camp, money to come from the Lutefisk fund. Motion carried.
- C. Railing to the altar: inquiry into this has been made by some members. The building committee will research this and get back to council.
- D. Fellowship Hall use: Angie Smith has been using the fellowship hall on some Saturdays, for scrapbooking retreats. Angie has inquired about the possibility of using it on a Friday night and Saturday. A motion by Karen Anderson, seconded by Gordy Briggs to charge \$50 for the Friday pm/Saturday combo use of the fellowship hall. Angie is to contact the church office the Thursday prior to the retreat and to have the deposit in at this time and to follow the rental agreement that is in place, and to know that church activities take precedence. Motion carried.
- E. Cemetery Secretary: the new constitution states that the cemetery secretary should be appointed by the council. A motion by Tracy Smith, seconded by Mary Schmitz to appoint Janet Stephenson as cemetery secretary. Motion carried.
- F. Devotions for March: Rod Nordeng

A motion by Gordy Briggs, seconded by Tracy Smith to adjourn the meeting. Motion carried.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:50pm with members praying the Lord's Prayer.

Marshall Church council met for its regular meeting March 6, 2013. Present: Pastor Natacha Kemp, Dale Himebaugh, Darrell Gordon, Brenda Hanson, Gib Seimers, Andrew Sprau, Gary Kulow, Rhonda Hatle, Carie Hanson and Cathy Sprau. Absent: Jerry Sprau and Luvern Hanson.

Chairman Dale Himebaugh called meeting to order. Secretary's report was given for the month of February. Financial secretary and treasurer's report was given by Carie Hanson (in the absence of Luvern Hanson, treasurer). Total offering for the month of February was \$3,352.84. Cause of the month was \$177.10, Rachel's Hope. Total offering thus far for 2013 is \$6,395.05. Reviewed expenses. A motion by Gary Kulow to accept reports. 2nd by Gib Seimers. Motion carried.

Cause of the month for March is Brevig Mission. A motion by Gary Kulow to give to a youth fund for April's cause of the month. This would help with expenses for our youth activities. 2nd by Darrell Gordon. Motion carried.

Pastor Natacha shared the menu and preparation for the "Seder Meal" that will be held during our Lenten service on March 13, 2013 at Little Cedar. She is obtaining information about the copyright issues for taping our worship services.

Old Business: Gary Kulow gave a report of the personnel committee. Reviewed the job description for the pastor.

Dale Himebaugh has contacted Schmitz Electric to check on the proper discharge of our water softener. Gary Kulow shared some suggestions for the replacement of the church's roof. Suggested we look at channel steel as an option for the roof. He will check about getting an estimate for this. Dale Himebaugh will obtain estimates for the other options for the roof.

Outside step's carpet needs to be replaced. Gary Kulow will check with carpet dealers for estimates for this. Will need to wait till at least May to do the replacement.

Discussed the taping of the worship services. Marshall will need to purchase equipment to do this. Shared different options for this. Andrew Sprau will check into the variety of equipment available. Will obtain estimates for the different options to use.

New Business: The blacktop on the road by the church made need to be sealed this year. will table for now. A motion by Gary Kulow to adjourn meeting. 2nd by Andrew Sprau. Motion carried.

An Easter Message from Bishop Usgaard of the SE Minnesota Synod

Partners in Ministry:

It is the last sentence in Luke's passion narrative; it goes almost unnoticed: "On the Sabbath they rested according to the commandment."

What a week: the entrance into the city, at table for the last supper, garden prayers interrupted by betrayal, accusations confirmed by a rooster's crowing, mocking and beatings, the weight of a cross too heavy, darkness and the curtain torn and his final cry, "Father, into your hands I commend my spirit," another good man named Joseph, the spices and ointments prepared. That is enough for anyone's week. But now they could rest.

What a week. But for you, partners in ministry, it has been more than a week, it has been 40 days. In addition to your ongoing schedules, you have invited your people to join in the journey to Jerusalem. There have been Wednesday services and activities, unique learning opportunities, weekend musicals, Lenten devotionals, and special home-bound invitations. And now, in the holiest of weeks, the triduum of Eucharist and cross and Baptism. I know what it is like. It is so important, and it is so tiring. But now you also can rest.

Except not quite yet. First there comes a trip to the tomb now empty. There we see the linen cloths laying. We meet the angels come once again to proclaim good news. It is Easter morning. It is the very center in our life of faith. It is the high point of our church year. There remains worship work to do, yet not really work. Now is celebration. Now the flowers have come alive. Now the music echoes, the bread and wine are poured. Now we proclaim that Jesus Christ is risen, and we sing "The Strife is O'er, the Battle Done."

It is then, in that promise, that we are truly able to rest.

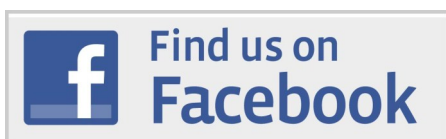
