A New Chapter, A Shared Ministry

"Be devoted to one another in love. Honor one another above yourselves." — Romans 12:10

Dear Beloved,

If you had asked me about twelve years ago, when I first moved to this country as a graduate student, "What is your next step?" I would have confidently said that I would finish my studies and return to Tanzania to serve my community. Yet, here I am—years later—in Adams, serving God among you. Because as Isaiah wrote, 'God's thoughts are not our thoughts and neither are our ways His ways' (Isaiah 55:8-9). From the very first day I spoke with the church council about the possibility of becoming your pastor, I heard God's voice clearly saying, 'my ways are higher than your ways, and my thoughts than your thoughts.' I do not take this call lightly. I grew up in a small village in Tanzania, nurtured by a close-knit community. My parents are small-scale farmers, and I still love the smell of rain and the feel of mud underfoot. Green is my favorite color because it reminds me of cornfields after the rain. I spent much of my childhood running through the fields and chasing chickens—a simple life that continues to shape who I am today. And believe me or not, Winter in Minnesota became my favorite season, because it brings freshness in the air and coziness in our homes. As a pastor in Tanzania, most of the congregations I served were in small, rural villages. Later, I became a professor of music, but even then, I deeply missed serving in a congregation. There is something profoundly sacred about small communities and rural churches: they know and care for their people in ways that reflect the heart of the Gospel. This truth is deeply rooted in our Christian story. Those who study history will know that the Church did not begin as a large, structured institution. The early gatherings not yet called "churches"—began in people's kitchens and living rooms. These communities shared meals, reflected on their faith, read whatever sacred texts were available (there was no Bible yet), and prayed for one another. These gatherings became the foundation of Christian fellowship, encouragement, and spiritual growth. From these humble beginnings, the Church was born - a family of brothers and sisters united in faith and centered on the Lord's Supper. And we must remember that women were often at the heart of these gatherings, serving and leading in ways that embodied the very essence of ministry. For to share gifts, to serve one another, and to nurture community is to be the Church. This is the first of many reflections I hope to share with you. I am deeply excited and grateful to serve among you. As a teacher, my passion is to learn from you and to grow together as we discern God's call for our shared ministry. What is God inviting us to do together in this time and place? As your pastor, I promise to be present with you—to help create a space where each person is seen, valued, and cared for. The Apostle Paul reminds us in Romans 12:10: "Be devoted to one another in love. Honor one another above yourselves." That is our shared calling—to love and serve one another, and through that love, glorify God in our community and beyond. May His name be glorified through all we do together in this new chapter of our shared ministry.
