Waiting!
Isaiah 11:1–10
A shoot will come up from the stump of Jesse; from his roots a Branch will bear fruit.

Every time since November, when the temperature drops, I have watched our son Abner - nine years old, move close to the window hoping to see snow coming down. And this year, he sighed many times, telling us how disappointed he was that the snow was late. I am sure most children look forward to that part of the year - snow, when they can put on their snow pants and run outside to build snowmen. I love winter too, but for a different reason. The last time I went sliding with the youth, I flipped over and nearly broke my hip. That was when I realized there had been changes in my body - that I was not as young as I once was. These changes come whether we admit them or not, whether we notice them or not. But I still love winter because it brings fresh air. The miracle of winter is that everything seems to go to sleep, even trees and bushes. Squirrels get a break from running around, and deer find a quiet place to stay warm - all waiting.

That is what Advent is. Advent is often described as a season of waiting. But Scripture presents a different kind of waiting, a waiting that sees what is broken and hopes for what God is bringing to life. Isaiah 11 looks at a landscape that felt cut down to a stump; politically, spiritually, and socially. Yet Isaiah dared to say that God was not finished. He speaks of a new shoot growing from that seemingly dead stump of Jesse. It is a sign that God brings renewal even when the present seems hopeless, or the future appears closed off. This new ruler, according to Isaiah, would not favor the powerful, but would defend the poor, confront what is harmful, and make room for genuine peace. Under his reign, predators and prey would dwell together, and children would play in places once thought unlivable. Isaiah imagines a world reordered around God's justice and peace, not human fear or self-interest. That is the kind of waiting Advent calls us into. The waiting that keeps our eyes open to small signs of renewal. The waiting that refuses to believe that decay or division have the final word. The waiting that trusts God can bring life out of what we fear is beyond repair.

As winter slows the world around us, this Advent invites us to slow our hearts just enough to notice what God is stirring. Watch, look closely, and see: where, even in the coldness of this season, both literal and spiritual, do we see a new shoot emerging?


