

The LINK provides a safe environment where youth ages 16-24 can receive nonjudgmental assistance from caring and trustworthy adults who are knowledgeable in overcoming the barriers of homelessness.

They offer a wide range of services, training and tools to support youth in becoming productive, healthy and independent adults. They assist young people in meeting basic needs by providing food, clothing and information on how to access short-term shelter.

Support is tailored to fit each person's needs and can include case management, life-skills classes, host homes for youth, transitional housing services, and peer support group activities and employment support. Financial assistance for rent and/or a rental deposit may also be available for youth who meet eligibility requirements.

At the end of March, our confirmation students and their mentors will be putting together personal care
