




#### Genesis 1:26-31





#### Little Cedar Council Meeting Minutes June 21, 2017

Little Cedar Church council met at 7:30 p.m. on Wednesday, June 21, 2017. Bryce Nelson called the meeting to order. The mission statement was read in unison. Sarah Mergen gave devotions. Present: Pastor Jeremy Johnson, Mike Lamp, Joe Matheis, Sarah Mergen, Bryce Nelson, Lahoma Retterath, Dixie Rose, Janet Stephenson, Nancy Thalberg, Shari Wagner, Jan Weness, Millie Weness. Absent: Linda Logsdon, Steve Schroeder, Sherry Schotanus, Susan Ydstie.

<u>Secretary's Report:</u> <u>Motion</u> by Lahoma Retterath, <u>seconded</u> by Millie Weness that the secretary's report from the April meeting be approved as printed. <u>Carried</u>. There was no meeting in May because of bad weather.

**Correspondence:** A thank you note from Lydia Wik was read thanking LC for the Bible.

A request for donations to Good Earth Village was read. <u>Motion</u> by Nancy Thalberg, <u>seconded</u> by Shari Wagner that Little Cedar donate \$1000 to GEV, with payment from lutefisk funds. Carried.

Tara Mandt, youth and education director, gave a report to the council. She described some of the changes she is hoping to make in the Sunday school program and 6<sup>th</sup> grade religious education. She requested that she be able to set up specific Sunday school rooms for our growing number of preschoolers and be allowed to buy a small round table for the room. Motion by Sarah Mergen, seconded by Lahoma Retterath that Tara purchase the items needed for the room with money from the Dean Julifs account. Carried.

- =Tara shared that Confirmation will now begin in 6<sup>th</sup> grade. They will probably meet only part of the school year, with the 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grades meeting all the school year. Final planning still to be done.
- =Tara has had two meetings with the youth and their parents who will be attending the LYO convention next summer in Houston. Twenty two students are planning to attending.
- =There are 85 students registered for Vacation Bible School.

<u>Treasurer's Report:</u> Millie Weness reviewed the printed report. Motion by Lahoma Retterath, <u>seconded</u> by Joe Matheis that the treasurer's report be accepted as printed. <u>Carried</u>.

<u>Pastor's Report:</u> Pastor Jeremy reported on some of the highlights from the Synod Assembly. He reported a pastor shortage. The synod is asking congregations to target potential candidates and has set a goal of 35 seminarians from our synod. He reported that there were several learning events at assembly and that four resolutions were passed.

- =Pastor reported that there is a request for choir and hand bell start-ups. Anyone interested in directing please talk to Pastor Jeremy.
- =There will be Campfire Worship once a month on Sunday evenings during the summer.
