wonder if our prayers make a difference.

As I write this I am also preparing my sermon for the week, and we hear Jesus teaching us the Lord's Prayer. Jesus is certainly our greatest teacher for prayer. Marshall Church Council ~ Meeting Minutes ~ July 10, 2013

Marshall Church council met for its regular meeting July 10, 2013. Present Pastor Jeremy Johnson, Dale Himebaugh, Darrell Gordon, Brenda Hanson, Gib Seimers, Gary Kulow, Andrew Sprau, Jerry Sprau, Rhonda Hatle, Carie Hanson, Luvern Hanson and Cathy Sprau.

Chairman Dale Himebaugh called the meeting to order.

Thelma Himebaugh and Linda Ludwig shared some of highlights from the Synod Assembly which they attended June 7&8 including the election of our new bishop, Steven Delzer from Faribault, MN. Some of the resolutions discussed were campus ministry and health insurance changes for pastors.

Devotions and prayer were given by Pastor Jeremy. Pastor's report was given. Pastor Jeremy and his family along with 8 others will be attending "Sonshine" Festival July 17-20 in Willmar, MN. Pastor is currently holding a worship service at Adams Health Care Center once a month. At this time no other pastor is participating with this. He is continuing to do visitations. Pastor will be gone Sunday, August 4, 2013. Will obtain a supply pastor for the worship service.

Secretary's report was given for the month of June. Financial secretary's report was given by Carie Hanson. Total offerings for June was \$4,842.30. Cause of the month, Red Cross, was \$223.30. Total offerings thus far for 2013 is \$24,276.77. Treasurer's report was given by Luvern Hanson. Reviewed expenses and the shared expenses. A motion by Gib Seimers to accept reports. 2nd by Gary Kulow. Motion carried.

Cause of the month for July is Southland Food Shelf. Cause of the month for August will be Cemetery fund and "Socks for the City" for September.

Old Business: The outside carpet for the steps has been ordered and will be installed June 17, 2013.

Jerry Sprau shared an estimate for the church's roof he had obtained. Will continue to check into other options and replace shingles as needed for now.

Dale Himebaugh reported that the energy audit was done by Freeborn-Mower Electric. A few suggestions were given, but no major concerns were found.

New Business: Luvern Hanson suggested contracting LP fuel for the upcoming season as prices are lower at present. He will check into doing this.

Dale Himebaugh shared a request for additional handicap bars in the bathroom. Dale had information on the type used at the Adams Health Care Center. A motion by Jerry Sprau to purchase a safety frame for the toilet. 2nd by Gary Kulow. Motion carried.

The family of Del Anderson would like to give a memorial to Marshall in his honor. They are asking for suggestions. Discussed several ideas for possible items for cemetery and church. Will continue to review ideas.

Vacation Bible School will be held July 29-August 2. Pastor Jeremy shared that there is still a need for donations and help with this. Discussed options for giving assistance with this. After much discussion, a motion by Jerry Sprau to give \$200 from our "Neighbor in Need" fund for this. 2nd by Darrell Gordon. Motion carried.

Continued with discussion with recording worship services. Pastor Jeremy shared that there is interest for this from shutins. Andrew Sprau will check into options for different devices to do this.

Marshall church council will meet August 14, 2013 for our next meeting as the Mower County fair is the first week of August.

A motion by Jerry Sprau to adjourn meeting. 2nd by Gary Kulow. Motion carried.

The Little Cedar Lutheran Church Council met on Wednesday, June 19, 2013 @7:30pm. Members present: Karen Anderson, Gordy Briggs, Pat Hinz, Bill Klingerman, Joe Matheis, Tricia Milks, Rod Nordeng, Tracy Smith, Jaymie Poshusta, Nancy Smith and Pastor Jeremy Johnson. Members absent: Becky Hartwig, Maynard Lewison, Lyn Meany, and Mary Schmitz. The meeting was called to order by Chair Pat Hinz. Council members introduced themselves to Pastor Jeremy and Pastor told council a little about himself.

DEVOTIONS/PRAYER: Karen Anderson

APPROVAL of COUNCIL MINUTES: A <u>motion</u> was made by Gordy Briggs, <u>seconded</u> by Rod Nordeng to approve the secretary's minutes for May, as printed. <u>Motion carried</u>.

CORRESPONDENCE/RECOGNITION of VISITORS:

- A. Kristina Matheis was present to report on the Synod Assembly she attended June 7-8.
- B. Osmundson Brothers Letter: they will no longer be hauling rock.

C. ELCA letter on Credit Union: the ELCA is exploring the feasibility of establishing a credit union. They are asking churches to respond to a survey on this matter. Rod Nordeng will take care of doing this.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Jaymie reported a -\$13, 091.18 in the general fund balance and a checking account balance of \$6791.09. A <u>motion</u> was made by Karen Anderson, <u>seconded</u> by Tricia Milks to draw up a letter to send to church members explaining the expenses coming up and the finances of the church. Discussion followed. <u>Motion carried</u>. Pastor Jeremy and Jaymie Poshusta will work on this letter to the congregation. A <u>motion</u> was made by Tracy Smith, <u>seconded</u> by Bill Klingerman to approve the treasurer's report as presented. <u>Motion carried</u>.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

A. <u>Building</u>: Pat Hinz reporting in Maynard Lewison's absence. The estimate for the new sidewalk by the daycare is between \$2000 and \$2500. Cracks in the parking lot should be fixed this summer yet. He received an estimate for a new roof over the fellowship hall: over \$40,000. He will get another estimate to have in case we need to proceed with this.

B. <u>Cemetery</u>: Tracy Smith reported that the committee will be replacing shrubs outside the fence and replace the locks on the shed to make it more secure and will clean it out. They would like to have a cement pad or concrete pavers to set the water tub on. Some holes were filled in on the roadway. Janet Stephenson is working with Dan Young on the directory. Janet is also working on getting all the graves on findagrave.com. Anderson Memorials will plot out the new section of the cemetery. The cemetery committee has been approached by 2 families who would like to plant some trees near the north end of the middle section. The committee would like to design an overall plan for trees in the new section. A <u>motion</u> was made by Tracy Smith, <u>seconded</u> by Gordy Briggs to allow the cemetery committee to go ahead with an overall plan for the cemetery, which includes planting trees and plotting out the new section of the cemetery. <u>Motion carried</u>.

C. <u>Daycare</u>: Linda Gilles reported that Morgan Mortenson received the Daycare Scholarship and recognized her thank you as well as a thank you from Sarah Schmit, the High School Counselor. They reviewed the March and April income/expenses. Karen Anderson added that the numbers are down this summer but should pick up again in the next month or so.

E. <u>Life/Missions</u>: Becky Hartwig reported via email. Suggestion for the July Cause of the Month: Adams Swim pool. Her committee discussed the shaking of hands during the sign of the peace. Installation of Pastor Jeremy is June 23, 2013. It will be followed by a potluck @ noon.

F. <u>Personnel</u>: Gordy Briggs reported that he spoke with Kathy Voigt about sick days. The committee thought it best to deal with any changes to the number of days and how they are labeled, in the fall, when they do their staff reviews, then bring to the council for approval. Gordy asked if Little Cedar would be willing to take a turn at hosting the Memorial Day Lunch. St. John's of Elkton and Sacred Heart currently do this, alternating years. Little Cedar could alternate with Sacred Heart. They generally serve between 100-125 people. The lunch is free will offering and the legion gives \$100 to the group serving. Council tabled this for another meeting.

G. <u>Youth/Education</u>: Tricia Milks reported that work is being done on VBS.

H. <u>Worship/Music</u>: no report

PASTOR'S REPORT: Pastor Jeremy reported that he will be attending a marriage workshop to be certified to counsel couples wishing to be married. The Sonshine Festival is in July and he has had a church service at the AHCC and will have another in July.

OUTSTANDING BUSINESS: none

A. Bill for bussing students to/from religious release classes: the bill comes to \$612.50

B. Energy Audit: Alliant provides a free energy audit. Discussion. A <u>motion</u> was made by Karen Anderson, <u>seconded</u> by Rod Nordeng to have the church proceed with the Alliant audit. <u>Motion carried</u>. Joe Matheis will take care of setting this up.

C. Campus Ministry: discussion on the possibility of having campus ministries come to church and speak, to encourage/inform our college bound students of the church ministries on college campuses. Pat will take this idea to the worship/music committee to discuss.

It is time to start looking for items for the Lutheran World Relief Kits!!

Please look at each list carefully as some changes have been made.

Include the following items in each Personal Care Kit:

- One light-weight bath-size towel (maximum 52" X 27"), dark color recommended
- Two bath-size bars (4 to 5 oz.) of soap, any brand, in original wrapping
- One adult-size toothbrush in its original packaging*
- One sturdy comb, remove packaging
- One metal nail clippers (attached file optional), remove packaging

*Do not add other items or leave out any of the items listed. All items should be new and in good condition. Wrap all the items in the towel and tie securely with ribbons or yarn. Do not enclose the Kit or any of its contents in plastic bags.

Include the following items in each Baby Care Kit:

- Two lightweight cotton t-shirts
- Two long- or short-sleeved gowns or sleepers (without feet)
- Two receiving blankets, medium-weight cotton or flannel, or crocheted or knitted with lightweight yarn, up to 52" square
- Four cloth diapers, flat fold preferred
- One jacket, sweater or sweatshirt with a hood, or include a baby cap
- Two pairs of socks
- One hand towel, dark color recommended
- Two bath-size bars (4 to 5 oz.) of gentle soap, in original wrapping
- Two diaper pins or large safety pins

Do not add other items or leave out any of the items listed. Gently used, clean items (no stains or tears) can be substituted

for new ones. Wrap items in one of the receiving blankets and secure with diaper pins. Do not enclose the Kit or any of its contents in plastic bags.

Include the following items in each Fabric Kit:

- Two pieces of cotton or cotton-blend fabric (no knits or 100% polyester). Each piece should match one of the sizes below:
- o 21⁄4 yards of 60" wide fabric, or
- o 3 yards of 44" wide fabric, or
- o 4 yards of 36" wide fabric
- o Two spools of neutral-colored, general purpose thread, 250-300 yards each

Fabric should have no stains or holes. Pieces do not need to match in size or color/pattern. Fold thread and one piece of fabric inside second fabric piece and tie with yarn, sturdy string, ribbon or a strip of fabric. Do not enclose the Fabric Kit or any of its contents in a plastic bag.

Include the following items in each School Kit:

- Four 70-sheet notebooks of wide- or college-ruled paper approximately 8" X 101/2"; no loose-leaf paper
- One 30-centimeter ruler, or a ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other
- One pencil sharpener
- One blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well)
- Five unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers; secure together with a rubber band
- Five black or blue ballpoint pens (no gel ink); secure together with a rubber band
- One box of 16 or 24 crayons
- One 2¹/₂" eraser
- Drawstring School Bag will be provided

Do not add other items or leave out any of the items listed. All items should be new and in good condition. Remove any excess packaging, pack all items in bag and close. Do not enclose the Kit or any of its contents in plastic bags.
