

GOD'S REVEALED LIGHT

Psalm 27:1

"The LORD is my light and my salvation; whom shall I fear?
The LORD is the stronghold of my life; of whom shall I be afraid?"

We live in a world that speaks a constant language of fear. It comes to us in all different forms, gnawing uncertainties about our placement, worth, security, and purpose. This world often feels like what Isaiah called a "deep darkness" a shadow of hate, doubt, regret, isolation, and brokenness. Often we are tempted to accept this dimness as the only reality, to let our hearts be governed by its unpredictable rhythms of worry and self-preservation. But into this pervasive darkness, God speaks definitively: "I am your light." The Epiphany season celebrated this glorious revelation. God made manifest in Christ, the Light to the nations. This is the light that exposes truth, guides our paths, and dispels the lie that we are alone in the struggle.

God has revealed that our stronghold is not a flawless plan or our own perfection and powerlessness, but a "Person." He is interested in you. In Him, we are fully known, given shelter, and sent into the world. That is the Good News.


Now, we step from the season of celebrating the Light revealed into the season of allowing that Light to examine every corner of our lives. Lent invites us on a deliberate, 40-day journey with Jesus into the wilderness. This is a journey not into deeper darkness, but into the clarifying light of His radical love and presence. It is here, in the place of intentional focus that we undertake the sacred work of self-examination. I invite you to walk alongside Jesus into this season of reflection. We live in a world that's great at checking on things. We check our bank accounts, our health, our homes, and our phones. We know that if we ignore these things, they can break down. But what about our souls? How long will we let the world's noise manage us or tell us who we are instead of quietly letting Christ's kind and healing light show us the truth?

There's an old saying: "The unexamined life is not worth living." If that's true for ordinary life, how much more important is it for our life with God? Self-examination isn't about a guilty or negative focus on everything wrong with us. It's a brave and hopeful turn toward God. It is simply admitting that before God's Spirit can fix and restore us, He must first show us what needs His touch. And here is the beautiful, safe part: we do this because of the cross. We don't look inside to beat ourselves up. We look inside to find what hurts, what makes us angry, where we are stuck, so we can bring it straight to Jesus' certain mercy.

We can do this without fear because the promise stands: "The LORD is our light and our salvation; whom shall we fear? The LORD is the stronghold of our life; of whom shall we be afraid?"

The Little Cedar Lutheran Church Council met on Wednesday, January 28, 2026, at 7:30 p.m. The meeting was called to order by President, Holly Meyer. The Mission Statement was read. Tara Mandt led with a devotion and prayer.

Attendance: Lyndsey Hall, Pat Sorenson, Holly Meyer, Jim Johnson, Tracy Smith, Mike Lamp, Kiyanna Meyer, Joe Matheis, Tara Mandt, and Pastor Emmanuel Kaghondi. Absent: Dixie Rose and Brady Voigt

Secretary's Report: A motion was made by Pat, seconded by Tracy, to approve the minutes of the December meeting. Carried

Correspondence: There was no correspondence.

Treasurer's Report: The Treasurer's Report was reviewed. A motion regarding approval of the report was tabled until the February 11th meeting due to additional corrections that need to be made.

Committee Reports:

Finance: We reviewed the Marshall shared-expense report.

Building: We discussed lowering the church building value to \$3,904,800 to save on premium. Roger Weness applied for a grant and the church will receive two free trees for the south side of the lawn.

Cemetery: The door on the shed was replaced.

Education: First Communion will be starting on February 18th.

Life & Missions: No report at this time.

Personnel: No report at this time.

Youth: No report at this time.

Worship & Music: We are working on skits for Lent.

Pastor's Report: The Pastor's Report was presented. Pastor Emmanuel updated us on Bishop Hassanally's trip to Tanzania. He has been busy with member visits.

Old Business:

1. Sound System: Tara gave an update. We should be able to make the switch to the back of the church soon.

Old Piano: The Cedar Court apartments will take our old piano.

New Business:

1. A motion was made by Joe, and seconded by Jim to elect Holly Meyer, President and Tracy Smith, Vice President for 2026. Carried.
2. A motion was made by Pat, and seconded by Tracy to elect Joe Matheis, Treasurer, and Lyndsey Hall to fill his remaining term of one year.
3. Holly explained the financial situation from the Annual Meeting. We will have a Congregational Meeting on February 15, 2026, to rescind the Treasurers Report and Financials and then present new financials for approval.
4. A motion was made by Joe, and seconded by Pat to endorse Lynnette Gerber, Kern Hall, Sam Mueller, Spencer Medgaarden, and Tracy Smith for our Call Committee. Carried.
5. We discussed the new lease for the copier. The monthly premium will go down 25%. A motion by Lyndsey and seconded by Mike to approve the new lease. Carried.
6. A motion was made by Tracy and seconded by Mike to lower the value of the church building insurance. The premium will now be \$13,966 a year.

The next council meeting will be on February 11, 2026. Devotions will be given by Pat. There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned and closed with the Lord's Prayer.


