³¹ He told them another parable: "The kingdom of heaven is like a mustard seed, which a man took and planted in his field. ³² Though it is the smallest of all seeds, yet when it grows, it is the largest of garden plants and becomes a tree, so that the birds come and perch in its branches."

Greetings Little Cedar and Marshall!

Mother Nature doesn't seem to know what is going on this winter. On Monday, I took out my bike and went for a ride. Then on Tuesday night it snowed and got down to 0 degrees. And now I hear we are supposed to be back into the 60s this weekend. If I'm getting confused by the weather, I'd have to think that all the trees and creatures are getting confused as well. The strange weather makes me nervous about what spring and summer will mean for us and the farmers.

The Bible often uses agricultural imagery to speak about our faith, and one such metaphor is the idea of planting seeds. Just as a tiny seed carries the potential for a mighty tree, we too hold within us the power to be agents of transformation and positive change in our world.

In the Gospel of Matthew, Jesus spoke of the mustard seed, describing how the smallest seed can grow into a large and fruitful tree. This analogy teaches us that even the seemingly insignificant actions we take, when rooted in faith and love, can bring about great change.

I am thoroughly enjoying the skits that we are having at our Wednesday Lenten services. As individuals and as a community, we are called to be seeds of change. What does it mean to be a seed for change? It starts with a humble recognition of our potential impact. Just like a seed needs the right soil, water, and sunlight to grow, we too need the nourishment of God's Word, the living water of His Spirit, and the light of Christ's love to flourish.

Planting seeds involves intentional acts of kindness, compassion, and justice. It means looking for opportunities to make a positive difference in the lives of those around us. It may be a simple act of kindness, a word of encouragement, or a commitment to social justice that can take root and grow into a beautiful expression of God's love.

Our skit for this week was a reminder that we grow together. As we make a difference in this world, we are not alone. Our actions have a ripple effect that can continue. Much like a seed that multiplies and spreads, our acts of love and kindness have the potential to inspire others to do the same. We become part of a collective effort to bring forth God's kingdom on earth—a kingdom characterized by love, justice, and reconciliation.

May we embrace our calling to be seeds of change, trusting that God is at work in and through us. May our collective efforts bring forth a bountiful harvest of love, compassion, and transformation in our community and beyond.




