Day 1 - Sunday, July 24

The Little Cedar Lutheran Church council met on **Wednesday**, July 20, 2022, at 7:30 p.m. in the narthex. Present: John Jax, Pastor Jeremy Johnson, Lynn Johnson, Carol Matheis, Spencer Medgaarden, Holly Meyer, Nancy Thalberg, Jan Weness, Millie Weness. Absent: Chris Roser, Connie Sathre, Tracy Smith.

The meeting was called to order by Spencer. The Mission Statement was read in unison. Devotions were given by Pastor Jeremy.

Secretary's Report: Motion by Holly, seconded by John to accept the secretary's report with the correction of the spelling of

Pastor Dobell's name. Carried.

Correspondence: A thank you was read from St. Peter's Church in Rose Creek thanking Little Cedar for the use of a classroom for religious release classes.

Financial Report: Millie reviewed the reports from the last two months and the year up to date. We are about \$11,000 behind last year's donations. Millie informed us that there will be three children going to Good Earth Village for Bible camp. The church pays 50% of the balance of registration after WELCA gives their donation toward registration. Millie noted that we haven't made a donation to Good Earth Village yet this year. <u>Motion</u> by Millie, <u>seconded</u> by Nancy to give \$1000 to GEV out of lutefisk funds. <u>Carried.</u>

seminary expenses to prepare for ministry to his native congregation in Austin. This will be the Cause of the Month for September and October. The donation will come from lutefisk funds. Carried. Pastor will give more information to the congregation beginning in September.

-Motion by John, seconded by Carol to accept the treasurer's report as printed. Carried.

Committee Reports:

Building: The adjuster will be here soon to assess the possible hail damage to the roof.

Cemetery: The committee has a meeting scheduled for next week.

<u>Daycare</u>: Kate is still looking for a part-time assistant beginning in September. Daycare fees will be raised by 5 % for the next contract period.
