What did you delight in this summer?

Where did you see God's *creative goodness?* My mom was bursting to show us a nest she had found when picking chokecherries. It held four lovely blue speckled eggs. Isaac touched them and declared, "They are warm, Grandma!" This, as Mary Oliver penned, is more wonderful than all the cleverness of our times: worth more than all the electricity of New York City.

I walked in the woods at Good Earth Village the Friday before campers arrived and heard the voice of a meadowlark. Clear, sweet, singing on the long grass, praising God for the fresh morning.



The week before I started with you (LC &; M), I visited my brother in Washington D.C. We had a delightful time together enjoying art museums and scrumptious food. "Litte Beasts: Art, Wonder and the Natural World" was a special exhibit at the National Art Gallery. It brought the curiosity and wonder of Renaissance artists and natural historians to enthuse us today. They collected, drew and painted the insects and flora at their doorsteps and those arriving via global trade in the late 1500's. Many argued that the intricate structures and instincts of insects revealed Gods majesty and their variety showed God's creative power. Their understanding of Christianity

caused them to marvel at the power and might seen in the least creatures of all. The study of insects in this period (500 years ago!) laid the groundwork for our current understanding of biodiversity. Looking closely at the amazing art of little beasts of Van Kessel, Hoefnagel, Peeters and others definitely was a God sighting for me. God is so creative and given extraordinary insects an indispensable role in our world. We cannot sustain life without these fabulous little creatures.

So, find a dragonfly, butterfly, beetle or bee to marvel at and praise God for. And think of how wondrous you are, child of God, apple of God's eye, pearl of great price. Then, your heart and eye will have more wonder and openness for another child of God who needs to be noticed.
