

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Marshall Church Council ~ Meeting Minutes ~ June 5, 2013

Marshall Church council met for its regular meeting June 5, 2013. Present: Pastor Jeremy Johnson, Dale Himebaugh, Darrell Gordon, Brenda Hanson, Gib Seimers, Gary Kulow, Andrew Sprau, Jerry Sprau, Rhonda Hatle, Carie Hanson, Luvern Hanson and Cathy Sprau.

Chairman Dale Himebaugh called the meeting to order.

Devotions were given by Pastor Jeremy with scripture reading and prayer. Pastor's report was given. Pastor Jeremy stated he was excited to be part of Marshall and Little Cedar. He shared information about "Sonshine" festival which is held July 17-20 in Willmar, Minnesota for youth. He will continue to share information if there is an interest in this. Vacation Bible School will be held July 29- August 2 at Little Cedar. Discussion on Adams Healthcare Center and a worship service there. Pastor will check with other area churches about this. Pastor Jeremy, Thelma Himebaugh, and Linda Ludwig will be attending the SE Synod Assembly June 7& 8. Pastor will be working on visitations for shut-ins as well as the other members of our church to get acquainted.

Secretary's report was given for the month of May. Financial secretary's report was given by Carie Hanson. Total offerings for May was \$3,887.47. Cause of the Month was \$189.47 ("Neighbor in Need" Fund). Total offerings thus far for 2013 is \$19,434.47. Treasurer's report was given by Luvern Hanson. Reviewed expenses. A motion by Gary Kulow to accept reports. 2nd by Jerry Sprau. Motion carried.

Cause of the Month for June is Red Cross. A motion by Gary Kulow to have Southland Food Shelf as the Cause of Month for July. 2nd by Jerry Sprau. Motion carried.

Old Business: Gary Kulow shared that the carpet for the outside steps will be ordered.

Continue to check on options and vendors to replace the church's roof.

Dale Himebaugh shared that the energy audit by Freeborn-Mower Electric will be done on June 6, 2013.

Continue to discuss options for recording the worship service. Pastor Jeremy will check with shut-ins as to their interest and equipment available.

After much discussion concerning seal-coating the blacktop and parking lot, a motion by Gary Kulow to have Shay Nelson of Austin seal coat the blacktop to the corner and parking lot for approximately \$4,000. 2nd by Darrell Gordon.

Motion carried.

New Business: Installation of Pastor Jeremy Johnson will be held June 23, 2013 at both churches. After discussion, it was decided to have a potluck dinner at Marshall June 30, 2013 to honor him.

The council agreed to continue to have Forrest Himebaugh do the church lawn mowing. Jon Hanson has started the landscaping project (a boy scout project). Discussed the need for a work day at Marshall.

A motion by Gary Kulow to order 12 special crosses for our Confirmation students. 2nd by Rhonda Hatle. Motion carried.

A motion by Gary Kulow to adjourn meeting. 2nd by Jerry Sprau. Motion carried.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Pat directed council to review the treasurer's report attached to the agenda. \$12,000 will be transferred to the general fund, to cover housing allowance. A <u>motion</u> was made by Becky Hartwig, <u>seconded</u> by Karen Anderson to approve the treasurer's report as presented. Motion carried.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

A. <u>Building</u>: Maynard, Joe and Tracy all reporting that Kikers will fix the leak in the fellowship hall roof and fix the gutters. If the roof cannot be fixed, Kikers will prepare an estimate for a new roof, in case this should be needed. Daycare wanted the bushes out in the playground area, so Maynard and Joe removed them and hauled in some dirt. Grass will be planted there. They will talk to Weis Landscaping about possible sod. The building committee will do this. Cracks in the parking lot need to be fixed and they will continue to work on the emergency lights until all are okay.

****2013 Report of the SE MN Synod Assembly***

Always being made new

2013 Southeastern Minnesota

Synod Assembly

On June 7-8, 2013, the Southeastern Minnesota Synod gathered in assembly at the Mayo Civic Center, Rochester, Minn. Assembly participants gathered for worship, Bible study, reports from ministries of the synod, and the business of the synod. The assembly is the highest legislative body of the synod.

Election of a Bishop ~

Much of the 2013 Synod Assembly agenda was consumed with the important business of the election of a synod bishop. The Rev. Steven Delzer, Faribault, Minn., was elected to a six-year term as bishop. Delzer was elected on the fifth ballot with 310 votes. Rev. Vernon Christopherson received 171 votes. Rev Sarah Nietz and Rev. Glenn Monson were also on the fourth ballot with 73 and 68 votes, respectively. Delzer received to 232 votes.

"I have deep trust that the Spirit will be with us as we walk through the doors that God opens for us," said Delzer upon the announcement of his election. Rev. Delzer will be installed on September 7. Details will be announced.

Bible Study ~

Rev. Mark Hanson, presiding bishop of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA), let the assembly in two Bible studies focused on 2 Corinthians 5:14–21. Hanson's first Bible study asked participants to think about what they would Tweet from the text. "What phrase would stand out as such good news that you just can't keep it to yourself?," he asked. Hanson then invited people to imagine the future of the church and asked how it might overcome the three roadblocks he identified as hindering "inspired imagination of the ELCA's future:"

- A focus on the past
- Low expectations of the Holy Spirit
- Fear

In his second Bible study, Rev. Hanson characterized Christians as ambassadors for their faith. The best ambassadors, he explained, are those who are most attentive to their context, who listen and build relationships. "Be a first-class listener and a world-class noticer," Hanson urged.

(Synod Report cont'd) Worship ~

Worship was a celebration of Lutheran liturgy, music, and theology. A procession of crosses and streamers on Saturday morning highlighted the celebration. Bishop Harold Usgaard shared the message "It's all about God" in his Friday morning sermon. "[Jesus] responds to us not because we deserve it but because we need it. Do you hear? It is all about God," he preached. Saturday's sermon was delivered by Presiding Bishop Hanson. It was a "participation required" sermon when Hanson told everyone to get out their phones or a piece of paper to tell someone about the good news of the Gospel. "The news is too good to keep to yourself," he proclaimed.

Other Business ~

Other business of the synod included reports from leaders and ministries including Bishop Usgaard, Luther Seminary, Portico Benefits Services, and more. The assembly also discussed and passed five resolutions and a proposed 2014 budget. Resolution actions included:

- Bestow the honorary title of "Bishop Emeritus" upon Rev. Harold Usgaard
- · Encourage congregations to complete an environmental audit and study care for creation
- Approve the "Minimum Compensation and Benefits Guidelines" document
- Request the synod council to establish a task force to focus on encouraging support of Lutheran Campus Ministry and ask congregations to celebrate a "Campus Ministry Sunday"
- Challenge congregations to continue providing healthcare benefits at or above the level they now provide them as health care changes in the coming months Presiding Bishop Hanson brought a report from the churchwide ministry of the ELCA. He challenged the assembly to not spend the coming years sowing seeds of discontentment, but the ELCA witness over the next years should be "you are welcome at the Lord's table." The culture deserves to hear a strong Lutheran witness to the Lutheran Confession. "We are people called to be witnesses to the Cross." We, as a living community of faith, are called to where there is suffering in the world. In Bishop Usgaard's report to the assembly, he gave thanks to the synod staff and to his wife, Lynette. He celebrated exciting ministries of the synod that engage youth and young adults.

Other Highlights ~

The churchwide expression of the ELCA and the Southeastern Minnesota Synod have worked to increase participation of youth and young adults in the church. This year Karen Gieseke, Synod Children, Youth, and Family Ministry Coordinator, hosted a hospitality suite for youth and young adult voters. She challenged those who joined her for lunch on Friday to understand and use their gifts for the ministry of the church. On Saturday, Presiding Bishop Hanson joined them for conversation. As the 2013 Synod Assembly was the last assembly for Bishop Usgaard and his synod staff, Friday night's banquet honored the synod staff. Friends and colleagues of the staff shared stories of the ministry of the nine staff members. The synod council will host a celebration dinner at the Doubletree Hotel, Rochester, Minn., on August 22 to honor Bishop Usgaard. Details will be released as available.

About Our Synod

The Southeastern Minnesota Synod is a faith community of 125,000 baptized people in 176 congregations as well as related institutions of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA). Its geographic area includes 15 counties in the southeastern corner of Minnesota.
